The Angela Davis-Ruchell Magee case was one of the last
big cases involving militant blacks in the 1960s and early
1970s-The Angela Davis Defense Committee made this
case big news. Davis was a radical academic, and a
member of the Communist Party-USA. The case revolved
around her support for the Soledad Brothers and other
prison support activity in the case of the "slave
rebellion" in the Marin County (Ca) Courthouse. Magee
had been a prisoner who was part of the "slave
rebellion" at that courthouse. Davis was acquitted of all
charges. Ruchell Magee is still in prison over 50 years
