


June 2018 Events Schedule

Organizing Against Mass Incarceration

Edward Carson, CPUSA Boston All too often people are taught to see racism as individual acts and not as components of institutional racism or a system of dominance—the enslavement of Black and Brown people under the guise of capitalism, which has propagated the current predicament of mass-incarceration. With a system designed to target marginalized groups, imprisonment without rehabilitation does more harm than good. Private and government prisons profit from prisoners—hence the more people incarcerated means more profit. Mandatory minimums and three strike policies make for strict sentencing and contribute to the increase in prison populations nationwide. This engaging session explores current scholarship, while inviting the audience into a discussion of resistance and action, not talk. Join us for this thought provoking meeting.

Saturday, June 23 | 3:00 - 5:00 PM **An Extraordinary Month in China**

Wadi'h Halabi, CPUSA and CME May was truly an extraordinary month in China. It opened with a speech by Xi Jinping, general secretary of the Communist Party of China, reaffirming commitment to Marxism and its revolutionary message. This was followed by a massive World Congress on Marxism in Beijing on May 5-6, with over 2,000 participants from around the world. A forum on May 7 at the Academy of Marxism reviewed Marx's significance for humanity today. The month closed with a May 28 forum in Shenzhen organized by the International Department of the Communist Party of China; over 70 Communist Parties from around the world participated. Wadi'h Halabi spoke at two of these forums and will report.

The maiden turns out to be a natural-born sniper; her impressive skill and prowess make her stand out among men and women alike. Seeing Pavlichenko as a tangible threat, the German High Command gives orders to eliminate the girl whatever the cost. In the meanwhile, Lyudmila meets a man and falls in love. War fades into the background... Soon, however, another misfortune befalls Lyudmila leaving the man she loves on the brink of death and herself seriously wounded. The girl is pulled out of combat and later goes to the United States with a publicity visit. Eleanor Roosevelt welcomes Lyudmila in the White House and the two women soon become close. It won't be long before Pavlichenko stands before an audience in Chicago pressing for a second front. Will her words have the capacity to change the course of war?

Working Class Solidarity in China & Beyond

Although difficult, a failure to work together through these contradictions can set the stage for terrible defeats -- such as counterrevolution in the USSR, and weakening of the working class in general. Capitalism is in general crisis. This is a time for the working class to advance towards completing the transition socialism.

Theft of Property & Labor

Bill Okerman, Needham Area Immigration Justice Task Force Point Person, Wage Theft Initiative We will discuss the origins and legislative history of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts's so-called "wage and hour laws" and the gutting of the enforcement of those laws that began in the early 1990s. I will present and discuss evidence to show three things that are at the core of this fundamental failure of governance: (1) that the Massachusetts courts have repeatedly misconstrued the Commonwealth's wage and hour laws so as to gut their enforcement; (2) that the public officers of the Commonwealth who since the early 1990s have had the statutory duty to enforce the Commonwealth's wage and hour laws have repeatedly and systematically failed to carry out that mandate; and (3) that the Massachusetts legislature has failed to ensure that the wage and hour laws that it has enacted on behalf of the people of the Commonwealth are effectively enforced.
